Exploring the Pipeline - Faculty Counts and PhD Graduates

We thought that it may be interesting to explore what the pipeline of PhD graduates looks like for filling faculty positions. The charts below show an analysis of faculty and PhD data that exists in the FAEIS faculty and degrees awarded databases. We selected the Academic Area that has the highest number of PhD graduates for each of the three major FAEIS program areas:

- Plant Science (Agriculture)
- Human Development, Family Studies, and Related Services
- Natural Resources Conservation and Research



Faculty included in these counts are full-time, tenured and tenure-track faculty. Using the 10 year age brackets found in FAEIS, as one might expect, the largest group of faculty for all three program area examples exist in the 55-64 age bracket (baby boomers!). Combining the older age brackets of 55-64, 65-74 & 75+ we find:


- Plant Science 47% of faculty of known age are in the 55 74 age range (563 faculty in 2008)
- Human Development, Family Studies, and Related Services 43% of faculty of known age are in the 55 74 age range (164 faculty in 2008)
- Natural Resources Conservation and Research 47% of faculty of known age are in the 55 – 74 age range (80 faculty in 2008)

So the majority of faculty in each academic area is actually in the three younger age brackets (25-34; 35-44; 45-54).


Faculty Count in Plant Sciences at All Institutions in 2008



Faculty Count in Human Development, Family Studies, and Related Services at All Institutions in 2008




Faculty Count in Natural Resources Conservation and Research at All Institutions in 2008



There is a growth in the number of PhD degrees awarded since 2006 for the Plant Science and Natural Resources Conservation and Research academic areas. The number of PhD degrees awarded in the Human Development, Family Studies, and Related Services academic area is flat. The number of new PhD graduates in 2008 for each of the three academic areas is:


- Plant Science 408 in 2008 (1,097 for 2006-2008)
- Human Development, Family Studies, and Related Services 90 in 2008 (265 for 2006-2008)
- Natural Resources Conservation and Research 125 in 2008 (304 for 2006-2008) So at least for these three academic areas, there appears to be a full pipeline of graduates that could fill faculty vacancies.

Doctorate Degrees Awarded in Plant Sciences at All Institutions




