### Exploring Agriculture Enrollment by Race and Institution Type

This month we have explored the distribution by race in enrollment at all degree levels in the Agriculture, Agriculture Operations, and Related Sciences program area by institution type and for two years, 2004 and 2009. We have divided the institution type into Land-grant and Non-Land-grant institutions. In 2004, the FAEIS records included 52 Land-grant institutions and 33 Non-Land-grant institutions. In 2009, the FAEIS database included 70 Land-grant and 79 Non-Land-grant institutions. The tables above show the percentage of students by race/ethnicity group compared to the total enrollment of students of known race. Students of unknown race are not included in the calculations.

Several points can be inferred from the data.

- First, the percentage of minority race students enrolled in agriculture increased between 2004 and 2009 for both Land-grant and Non-Land-grant institutions.
- Second, for both years, the percentage of total minority students was higher in Land-grant institutions than in Non-Land-grant institutions.

- Third, Hispanics were the only minority group that had a higher percentage of students enrolled in Non-Land-grant institutions when compared to Land-grant institutions.
- And last, Land-grant institutions had a higher percentage of Non-U.S. citizen students enrolled than Non-Land-grant institutions in both 2004 and 2009.
