2011 USDA National Awards Program for Excellence in College and University Teaching

The deadline

March 15, 2011.

The USDA, National Institute of Food and Agriculture, has issued the call for nominations for the 2011 USDA National Awards Program for Excellence in College and University Teaching in the Food and Agricultural Sciences. This awards program honors innovation and excellence in

teaching. Recipients receive a stipend, plaque, and recognition during the national APLU conference. This awards program is open to faculty in all the food and agricultural disciplines.

Teacher nominees must be employed by a college or university that 1) confers a baccalaureate or higher degree in least one area of the food and agricultural sciences for which the teacher is nominated, 2) has demonstrated a commitment to the food and agricultural sciences, and 3) attributes a high priority to its educational mission.

Teacher nominees may be nominated in two categories: 1) Regional – A teacher is selected from any of the four regions, deemed by the review panel to exhibit sustained and meritorious teaching, and who has maintained at least five consecutive years experience in higher education

teaching. While a sustained pattern of meritorious activity is expected, this award does not recognize teaching longevity so much as the quality of recent achievements involving the teaching of philosophy, research

methodology, and self-assessment aimed at improvement; 2) New Teacher – A teacher is selected from any of the four regions, who has demonstrated a commitment to a career in teaching and is deemed by the review panel to exhibit meritorious teaching, but who has no more than seven consecutive years experience in higher education teaching. Tips for Creating Reports With Report Builder

Learn how to create an enrollment report that looks at gender and ethnicity of students enrolled in Bachelors degree programs in the area of agricultural business for all FAEIS partnering institutions from 2007-2009.

STEP 1: Login into the FAEIS Report Builder

- Go to the FAEIS web site at http://faeis.usda.gov and click "Enter the FAEIS Website."
- Click on "Report Builder" link at top of page.
- Enter in your FAEIS ID and password and click "Login."
- If you do not have a FAEIS ID, contact the FAEIS Help Desk at faeis@vt.edu.

STEP 2: Set criteria for the report

- Click the blue button beside "Layout."
- Under "Survey Type" click the pull-down menu and choose "Enrollment" and click "Set Survey."
- Under "Years" click the boxes of 2007, 2008, 2009 and click "Set Years."
- Along the menu at the top, click the blue button next to "Academic Filters."
- Click on the blue button next to "Select Disciplines."
- A menu will appear with all of the disciplines listed. Scroll down the list and click
 "Agribusiness/Agricultural Business Operations" and then click "Select one or more
 disciplines." Go back to the menu list and choose all of the disciplines that apply to
 agribusiness, holding down the CTRL-key to select multiple items. Click "Add a
 discipline to your list."
- Go to the top menu and click the blue button next to "Report Layout."

STEP 3: Design the report layout

- Under the table titled "Report Layout Enrollment Survey" go to "Columns" and use the pull-down menu to choose "Year."
- Go to "Sub-columns" and choose "Gender."
- Go to "Rows" and choose "Ethnicity."
- Go to the bottom of the table and click the button titled "Set Report."
- Go to the top menu and click the blue button next to "View Report."

STEP 4: Download report to your computer

- Your report will be on the screen. Below is an example of the report.
- Download an Excel spreadsheet version of the report by clicking on the blue button next to the title "Excel (download report to Excel worksheet)."
- Download a Word document of the report by clicking on the blue button next to the title "Word (download report to Word document)."

The FAEIS report created should look like the table below.

To collect the total enrollment for your unit which could be a college, school, or department, depending on the structure of your organization.


