
Special Edition FAEIS Newsletter for 1994 Tribal Land-Grants


Doctoral Degrees by Non-U.S. Citizens

Significant numbers of non U.S. citizens come to the United States to pursue doctorate degrees. For this month's newsletter we thought that it might be interesting to look into that topic a bit more. The charts below show the number and percentage of the total of all doctorate degrees by FAEIS program area that are awarded to non-U.S. citizens. 
Number and Percentage of Total Doctorate Degrees Awarded in 2008 for each of the Three Major FAEIS Program Areas

This is a new section for the FAEIS newsletter, where we feature a set of reports we have recently prepared for a FAEIS user.

This report request comes from Dale Whitaker, Associate Dean and Director of Academic Programs at the College of Agriculture, Purdue University. He wanted baccalaureate enrollment for the FAEIS program areas broken down by four racial/ethnic groups for the past 5 years for 1862 and 1890 institutions.
